

Marazion School Pupil Premium (PP) 2020-21: SAME; NEW; DIFFERENT

The following PP funding allocations for Marazion School have been agreed by the governing body for the school year 2020-21:

INTERVENTION AND LEARNING SUPPORT:

- Teaching Assistants (TAs) to support FFT/BRP early literacy intervention programmes
SAME - this allocation continues due to successful outcomes for 2018-19. The FGB is committed to early intervention.

SIP LINK Key School Driver:

- **To ensure that staff and governors are aware of barriers to learning for pupils (including PP and more able pupils) and the strategies in place across the school to address these barriers.**

- TAs as a Learning Support Team to offer one to one tuition: in class bubbles; across class bubbles and after school
DIFFERENT - an extension of Marazion School's One to One Tuition programme now includes children both KS1 and KS2 pupils. This aims to 'close the gap' in attainment in reading, writing or maths for focus pupils. This programme is delivered both during the school day and after school. This programme has been extended and repurposed because of the recent closing of schools due to a global pandemic. The FGB is committed to securing an accurate view of pupils' progress in each year group.

CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT:

- Funding for residential visits programme
DIFFERENT – this allocation now only supports residential visits. This continues due to FGB's commitment to enrich Marazion School's curriculum, providing a wide range of opportunities for our pupils both inside and outside the school day.

- *To continue to develop the bespoke Marazion creative curriculum, incorporating all the successful elements identified, resulting in the best possible learning opportunities for all children, maximising progress and attainment.*

HEALTHY ACTIVE CHILD:

- Staffing for *Breakfast Club* (BC)
SAME – the allocation for BC continues due to FGB's commitment to promoting the active child. Pupils are learning how to make changes for life: they understand that breakfast is a very important meal and makes a difference to learning.

SIP LINK PE and School Sport Key School Driver:

- *To support priorities in SIP with a focus on the development of PE, School Sport, Daily Physical Activity (DPA) and Healthy Active Lifestyles.*

MENTAL HEALTH AND EMOTIONAL WELLBEING:

- Counselling services for pupils
SAME – this allocation continues due to the FGB's commitment to provide bespoke in-house early intervention for emotional wellbeing. A School Counsellor is in school every Monday working with pupils and families.
