Early Literacy Support to deliver Fischer Family Trust (FFT) and Better Reading Partnership (BRP) programmes</b>            There is bespoke support for pupils working one to one and/or in small focus groups.</p> <p><b>Aim:</b> To accelerate the progress of focus pupils in reading and writing  <b>Impact:</b> Focus pupils make accelerated progress in reading and writing.</p> <p><b>2. Learning Support to deliver One to One Tuition programme</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Additional adults working to deliver one to one tuition in their class bubble, including after school</li> <li>• Additional adults working safely across class bubbles to deliver one to one tuition/small group work, including after school</li> </ul> <p><b>Aim:</b> To accelerate the progress of focus pupils in reading, writing and maths</p>	<p>£24067</p>

<b>Curriculum Development 2021-2022</b>	
<p>1. <b>Residential visits programme.</b> Pupils are given opportunities to access outdoor pursuits, water-based sports activities as well as island/city life. Residential visits are subsidised for PP pupils.</p> <p><b>Aim:</b> To use a programme of residential visits to enrich the curriculum at Marazion School in order to widen the range of opportunities available for pupils.</p> <p><b>Impact:</b> Residential visits enrich the curriculum of Marazion School and build self-esteem, independence, responsibility and resilience in pupils. Pupils take these skills into their learning.</p>	£5000
<b>Healthy Active Child 2020-2021</b>	
<p>2. <b>Staffing for Breakfast Club (BC).</b> BC opens at 8am and is free for PP pupils.</p> <p><b>Aim:</b> To provide an opportunity for pupils to eat breakfast in school.</p> <p><b>Impact:</b> Pupils who may not have breakfast every day have breakfast in school. A healthy hearty breakfast means a great start to learning for the day.</p>	£3000
<b>Mental Health and Emotional Wellbeing 2021-2022</b>	
<p>1. <b>Counselling service for pupils.</b> School Counsellor works in school every Monday.</p> <p><b>Aim:</b> To provide early support for mental health issues in school.</p> <p><b>Impact:</b> This provision raises awareness of the importance of providing early solutions to mental health issues. Mental health is discussed openly. Pupils and families gain knowledge of a range of strategies to cope with and manage their own mental health in order to improve emotional wellbeing.</p> <p>2. <b>Pastoral Support to provide woodland nurture sessions</b> Additional adult to lead nurture sessions outside the classroom, working with children across the school.</p> <p><b>Aim:</b> Children to work on exploring feelings and revealing confidence.</p> <p><b>Impact:</b> Children are able to manage their social and emotional needs effectively and independently.</p>	£16695
